

She will be missed. She wasn't this gregarious center of party type person. She was trustworthy, loyal, and dependable. She was a caretaker. She was quiet. She didn't talk a lot. I don't have many memories of her stories about her childhood which I am sad about now. She lived a full life. She was born in a war; she immigrated to the United States where she had to learn a new language and culture. She lost her husband at such a young age and raised 3 great kids.

Travel (Sylvia continued):

- 1. Not only did Tante Anita like to travel, but she invited others to join her! She took Tony with her and Gerhard on a car trip to California when he was in high school. She also took me to California - just she and I, but we flew! We went to Williamsburg, VA, and to Germany.*
- 2. Our trip to Germany is a great memory for me. One memory from that trip is when she arranged for us to stay with her cousin Sieglinda's daughter, Astrid. She remembered that Astrid and her husband ran a small hotel. Once we were in Germany, she called up Astrid and asked if she had "availability" for us to stay with them. We arrived at Astrid's home rather than a hotel. Astrid did not operate a hotel as Tante Anita thought. Tante Anita was mortified that she just invited us to stay with a family member who she has not seen since a child. She didn't sleep that night because she just felt horrible about imposing on Astrid and her family. Astrid did not seem too upset and was a great host.*

Funny memories (Sylvia continued):

- 1. As my brother gained his full height of 6 foot 5 inches, we notice the pictures that Tante Anita took of Tony seemed to never get his full head in. We even have a picture where Tony's head is tilted to the side and still, she clipped the top of his head.*
- 2. I realized that Santa Claus was Tante Anita! Every other year, our family would come to spend Christmas with Tante Anita. I was probably 8 the year I realized something. Santa always delivered our presents on Christmas Eve while we were at the Christmas Eve church service in the evening. We would come home from church and all the presents were there ready for us to open them up. I noticed this year that Tante Anita always stayed back from going to church or came to church later than the rest of us. So there was no Santa Claus but Tante Anita did a great job of making it magical!*

- 1. She worked hard to take care of her family. But she also made time to go on trips and have fun!*
- 2. She enjoyed creating through sewing and knitting. I have dresses, skirts, tops that she sewed for me. She knitted a lovely sweater for me. My mom has in her house the curtains and tablecloths that Tante created.*
- 3. She liked being involved in our lives. When I first moved to Chicago to attend Moody Bible Institute, she came to visit while I attended school. She came to my graduation.*
- 4. She made copies of pictures from our times together - family gatherings and traveling. Each picture had the name of the people, ages, as well as the date written on the back.*
- 5. She sent birthday cards and anniversary cards. Never missed a year until her dementia set in.*
- 6. She did kind acts of service. One example: My family went on vacation out of state... Tante Anita and her good friend Rose also went on vacation (but not with us). Tante Anita and Rose stayed at our house for a night while we were away. They left before we got home. My family pulled into the driveway and my mom said: "Oh, someone planted the flowers". My mom had gotten flowers before our vacation but did not have the time to plant them. Tante Anita and Rose planted them.*
- 7. She had stories about me as a kid. Who doesn't like to hear about stories about themselves! I like the story where Tante Anita was watching me and my brother while my dad and mom were in Brazil for a month. I'm not sure how old I was, but probably 3 or 4. I somehow left the yard and wandered the neighborhood by myself. Tante Anita ended calling the police because she couldn't find me. She was thinking to herself how she was going to tell my mom that she lost me. The police found me at the house behind her house. So I almost made it back!*
