“ Growing up, the Dressig family lived on Cornelissen, and on the other side of their backyard fence was the Black Elementary schoolyard. For many years, all summer long at least five days per week, a group of us played baseball right behind Dressig’s house on school grounds. This included the Fix’s, Jones’, Gurin’s, Kevin of course, sometimes the two young Don’s, and other body’s we could get for our pickup games. Dressig’s backyard fence was our Left Field home run fence. Most people would not like that one bit because every time somebody hit a home run, one of us would have to climb the fence to get the ball back. From 9:30am to dusk, in-between lunch, paper routes and after dinner, we usually played five to eight hours per day, depending on whether any of us had practice or a league game that night. You can imagine the number of times that fence got climbed. It would have been easy to yell and scream at us to go play someplace else. After all, there was a diamond with a backstop about three houses down facing the other way. We chose not to play there because the infield was rock hard with too many stones. It was never manicured. Our homemade field had a grass infield and basepaths from wear and tear. Sometimes, Mr. Dressig would appear out of nowhere to pick up a home run ball and throw it back to us. Partly, it was because he was being a nice guy, but also so that we didn’t climb the fence to come get the ball. One day, I think he had finally had enough of it after another home run. We were all getting bigger and stronger and home runs became more frequent. This time, I think it finally got to him. Mr. Dressig comes out the backyard, picks the ball up and rubs it one-handed. I came running up to the fence to get it and I could see the slight grimace on his face. In the nicest way possible, he says “Don’t you think it’s about time you moved home plate back a little bit”? I was fully expecting something harsh, but instead, he spoke in a smooth and calm tone in his voice. First off, he was right. It was getting too easy to hit that many home runs, but it sure was more fun for us. Secondly, he did not bite my head off. He flips the ball over the fence and I said, “You’re right Mr. Dressig, we’ll do it right now”. I had been known to buck authority from time to time, and he instantly disarmed me and gained my total respect and admiration from that day forward. Everybody always speaks to his being so funny, and he definitely was, but to me he had a way of relating to people that was really down to earth and incredibly likable. That was the day I began to admire him. Whatever he wanted, I would always do without hesitation. If I saw him at any event, I would always ask if there was anything I could get for him. He won me over for the way he handled one situation over 50 years ago. Crazy how life can be sometimes and the lessons we learn. He never tried to act cool. He didn’t have to - he already was.
