Donna Rose Arnson (nee Miller) was born April 11, 1952, in Grosse Pointe Farms, Michigan, and died on January 3, 2021, in Birmingham, Alabama. She is survived by her son, Gunner, her daughter, Katie Rose, son-in-law, Marty, and grandson, Lubo. She is also survived by her sister, Mary Lu, and brothers, Daniel and Richard. She was preceded in death by her father, John, and her mother, Angela Rose, and her brothers, Johnny, Tommy, and Bill.

Donna grew up in Grosse Pointe Farms, Michigan, the sixth born of seven children. After graduating high school, she attended Western Michigan University and later graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh, where she obtained her degree in nursing. As a registered nurse, she was incredibly passionate about helping others and advancing her knowledge in the field of medicine. She began her nursing career in Appleton, Wisconsin, and, after a move to Rochester, New York, continued her work in the cardiac unit.

After giving birth to her son, Gunner, the family moved to Mobile, Alabama, where her daughter, Katie Rose, was born. During her time in Alabama, she grew to love the area, which she would eventually come back to later in life. At an early age, she encouraged a love of music in her young children and promoted that throughout her lifetime. The family moved to Monroe, Louisiana, in 1991, where she transitioned her nursing career from patient care to utilization case management. For three years, they settled in a house on a bayou, but in 1994, the family moved again to Erie, Pennsylvania, where the children spent their formative years.

After 13 years in Erie, she moved back south to Birmingham, Alabama. Being a devout Catholic, she was drawn to the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN) and a job opportunity at UAB Hospital to restart her nursing career after years of being a dedicated mother. She loved her job and coworkers at UAB, where she really felt like she was making a difference. Her work ethic, enthusiasm, and acumen were noticed by all of her colleagues and her loving spirit shined brightly to all. In Birmingham, she found a special spiritual community and, because of her fearless and outgoing personality, she made many friends. She attended mass daily, was a committed adorer of the Holy Eucharist, and a strong devotee to the Holy Face of Jesus. Her Catholic identity truly defined her and she was always eager to share the love she found in her faith.

She will be missed immensely and will forever live in our hearts.

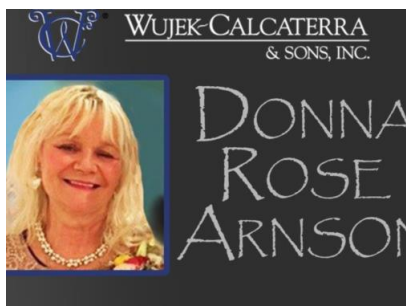
