Greg was always such a positive, upbeat guy off the court and a true gentleman but fierce competitor on the court. I must say what set him apart though, was his humility. Oddly enough that made him even harder to beat because you would never expect him to be such a great player, he was just that modest and talented.*

In 2013, Greg went 7-0 in doubles with Trey Keating and Bob Boyd to advance our 4.5 USTA team all the way to sectionals (midwest level). Our team won multiple matches 3-2 because of Greg. Him and Trey were the deciding match to advance at districts in a close third set tie break against Eastside (a very strong team) at the University of Michigan tennis facility. Being a first year captain, I was so nervous watching (as many others were, as well) but Greg had nerves of steel and hands of silk or gold...or maybe something not known to man, and pulled out a great win (as he always did) with Trey Keating on that day. I think it was 11-9 and it was just so amazing and exciting to watch considering everything. In hindsight, I feel like we should have rushed the courts, it was that big. In my 25+ years of playing/watching tennis, it is one of the best and most memorable moments that I have to this day and will have forever. On behalf of our whole team that year...Thank you, Greg Flewelling.
