March 29, 1954 - August 8, 2020

Maria Kourouvasilis was born in Boston, Massachusetts to Ethel Economo and Kosta Kourouvasilis, a survivor of the Greek genocide in Turkey. A dedicated student, she spoke five languages fluently. After graduating from Girls' Latin School, she obtained her BA from Boston University, studied for a year at the Sorbonne, and later earned two Masters Degrees, one in French and one in Spanish. She taught English as a Second Language and American citizenship to Southeast Asian refugees, University of Detroit students, and Mexican immigrants. She also taught French and Spanish in the Grosse Pointe Public School System for 26 years.

She was an active member of the Meadow Brook Garden Club, offering Greek pastries to fellow gardeners and watering the many urns during the growing season. She loved working in her own and others gardens as well.

Over the years, she was an avid supporter of community service organizations including St. John Greek Orthodox Church and St. Lazarus Serbian Orthodox Church, as well as the Friends of Kenyan Orphans and the Clinton Township Senior Center. Her happiest time was spent being with her loving family, especially the grandbabies.

She is survived by her sister, Tess Paicos (John+), her son John (Leslie), daughter Becky (Yanni) along with grandsons Nicholas, Aristides, Stelios, Constantine, Nikolaos, and Athanasios, as well as cousins, great-nieces and nephews, godchildren Dimitri, Nicholas, Kostantinos, and Jonovan, and her beloved bird Matia Mou.

Maria passed away quietly on August 8, 2020. Instate Wednesday, 9 am until 10 am. Funeral Liturgy at 10am at St. John Greek Orthodox Church, 11445 16 Mile Rd, for immediate family only. In lieu of flowers, the family asks that donations be made to St. John Philoptochos
