On December 22, at 12:00 a.m. Ron Wilson, age 78, approached Saint Peter at the gates of heaven. Claspings the hands of his loving son, Jeff Wilson, and beautiful daughter, Jodi Bara, Saint Peter welcomed Ron in. Although it was a painful good-bye, as they let go of his hands Ron was immediately met with a loving embrace from his wonderful wife Shirley. As they walked hand in hand together, Ron's baritone voice could be heard laughing and telling Shirley about their family, friends, and everything that has happened the past 21 years of her absence.

In the last few hours of his life, Ron was surrounded by his sister Shirley, his son and daughter, son in-law, daughter in-law, four grandchildren, 3 great grandchildren, and many close friends who were all able to pray with him and say their good-byes. Though the halls of the hospital were quiet that night, his impact on this world was loud.

A graduate of East Detroit High School, Ron stayed "East" and became a proud member of the Eastern Michigan University family. Ron was an honored captain of his track team in college. He even studied a year at Central Michigan University, which counted toward his 40 year status with Warren Community Schools, but, "don't tell anybody that!" Ron dedicated four decades to the Warren Woods Tower community as a teacher, coach, Athletic Director, Vice-Principal, and role-model to thousands of students. He was a beloved coach of the track team, and made a point to get together with his "track boys" every year.

The impact Ron has had on this planet truly stretches over lines, borders, and oceans. His shoes will not be filled, and nor could they be by any single man. We can share what he has shown us by doing good on to others and loving with each word and gesture.
