“ The last few days have been a blur. We lost a beautiful part of our family. Even though she was my mother in law, I was fortunate enough to gain a friend. That doesn't always happen. I met Teresa when I was only 12 yrs old. I quickly became interested in all her wonderful cooking. I would come by to visit her son but, often spent more time with her learning how to make homemade pizza, gnocchi, Spaghetti noodles and much more. I became a regular fixture at their home on Regal Dr! After her husband died, way to young, I also became her personal driver of sorts. She was terrified of driving and so off we would go. She often told me I was the daughter she never had. We didn't always agree on things but, I could speak to her openly and I always appreciated that about her. We spoke on the phone multiple times a day chatting about everything and anything. I was so blessed to say she was more than a mother in law but, a true friend. I will greatly miss those phone conversations, shopping trips, lunch outings and family time that we shared together. I would often tease my husband telling him I married him for his mother! That always got a good laugh out of him! Anyone who knew my mother in law knew she always worried about this or that with her health over the years. She was always thinking she was sick from something and would not recover even though she was always fine. This was not to be the case this time. Covid robbed us of precious time spent with her due to her low immune system. She was in and out of the hospital since before Thanksgiving. Christmas morning she went back in to the hospital and the sound of her voice told us this was something serious. We anxiously awaited updates for several days on how she was doing. I'm grateful that we were able to hear her voice one last time the day before she passed. She actually sounded good and we were again hopeful she could go home. I will never forget that terrible phone call in the early morning and our high speed drive to the hospital afraid we wouldn't make it on time to see her one last time and let her know how much we loved her. God was good and allowed us that precious time with her before he mercifully took her home and away from all the pain and suffering she had endured those last few months. We are still shocked and devastated but, have been shown many acts of kindness and words these last few days to comfort us. We thank everyone who has reached out to us. The next couple of days will be tough.
