At 46 years old he bought his second restaurant called Metropolis Family Dining in Warren and continued to own that for 16 years serving the community excellent Greek, American, and Italian meals. During all of these years he acquired hundreds of friends who would travel through the doors of the restaurant. These folks he considered family. In 2011 he became the chef for Charlie's Restaurant in St. Claire Shores, where he was extremely happy. Some would say Tony was the best chef in home cooking in Michigan and assisted the owner, Bob, in making the business a tremendous success. He worked there until the day he was diagnosed with lung cancer. Tony's greatest pleasures were time with his daughter, Kalli, and wife, Linda. He was devoted to them in every way, counseling his daughter as she worked

toward becoming a medical doctor. She brought unbelievable joy to her father in so many ways and became a kind and loving person like her father. Tony was a soldier in the Greek army as a young man and was awarded medals and stripes for competitive sharp shooting. He became an American citizen and took great pride in the fact he was an American. His entertainment and relaxation would often be a trip down to the coffee shop in East Detroit.
