“ *To Bruce's Family,
I wanted to share a few thoughts about Bruce and express my deepest condolences.*

I knew Bruce for a number of years, although much of what I know about his earlier life came through stories and conversations. What always stood out to me was the kind of man he was.

Bruce was a proud American and a public servant. As a police officer, he believed in the law and in serving others. He dedicated part of his life to protecting his community, and that commitment reflected the values by which he lived.

More importantly, Bruce was a devoted father. Life did not always follow a straight path, but he cared for and supported his sons through college and took great pride in being their father. He spoke about them with pride, and it was clear that their accomplishments and well-being meant a great deal to him. That dedication says a great deal about his character.

Bruce also loved life and lived it fully. He was an honest man who could connect with people from many different walks of life. He made friends easily because he genuinely cared about others and took an interest in them. Conversations with Bruce rarely stayed superficial for long; he wanted to know how people were doing and what was happening in their lives.

What I will remember most is his friendship. Bruce was the kind of friend who reached out, made time for people, and was always willing to be there. He welcomed us, entertained us, and made us feel valued. Whether it was a phone call, a visit, or simply taking the time to listen, he had a way of making people feel that they mattered. In a world where people are often too busy, Bruce never seemed too busy for his friends.

While I cannot speak to every chapter of Bruce's life, I can say with

confidence that he was a proud American, a public servant, a good father, and a loyal friend. Those are qualities worth remembering and celebrating.

He will be missed.
