"How is my favorite promoter?"
"Can I get an extra meal ticket and pass?" He would explain to me how electricity flows, always patient when I would ask the same questions over and over. He would tell me about his friends in Germany. He would tell me about the Detroit music scene in the 1970's-80's. He worked with everybody in Detroit, in all of the venues, he knew all of the players. And everybody knew him. He was one-of-a-kind. Every now and then I would work an event or a festival and house power would go down, or a storm would take out power, or a meter wasn't reading correctly and the artist would ask for a back up generator. What do you do? CALL DENNIS! "Dennis, can you get a unit out here in the next two hours? I have doors at 6pm". He always helped. He had access to generators all over Michigan and Ohio. I will miss speaking with him at 6am prior to load in and I will miss speaking to him at 2:00am after load out. Just knowing he is gone totally bums me out. I look forward to the day we come together and celebrate his life with his family and friends.”
