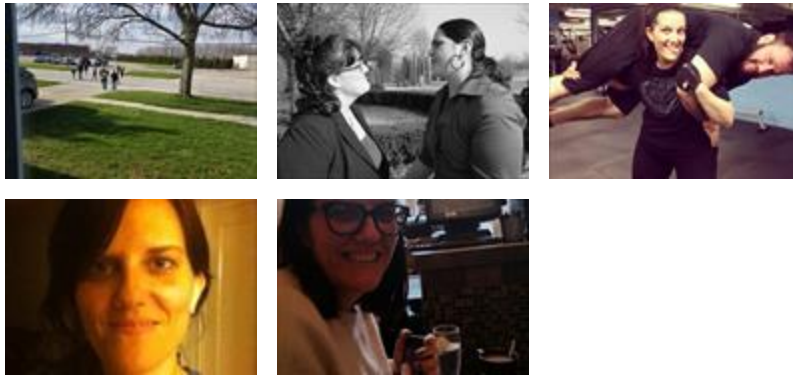

“ Kelly and I starting talking more in the past several years. Kelly was concerned about the company she worked for and wanted somebody to bounce ideas off of. I got to see first hand her absolute competitiveness and unwillingness to accept defeat in any venture. She threw herself more and more into the business as management was failing in multiple areas. Sales, purchasing, finance, internet sales, Kelly tried to save each area with little assistance from family management. She was torn but could see the handwriting on the wall and we would talk about her options. She started reviewing her life and seeing what she was giving up to live and work in New York. She decided to move back to Michigan.

After trying insurance sales she became General Manager for a restaurant in Detroit. Again, we would talk about her problems, which solutions might work best and how to approach them. She worked to improve the wait staff, throwing everything she knew to make them the best. She considered it a personal defeat if she could not bring their performance up to standards and had to let them go. She tried a number of tactics to get the chef and owners to see the areas they needed to address. I think when she was laid off, it was an admission of both sides that they could not save the restaurant.

Kelly had her quirks. She could never buy just 1 thing. It always had to be 2. She had to have quality coffee, Maxwell House would never do. She was reluctant to ever ask for help. Moving furniture in the Carmody house was always a negotiation because Kelly did not want me to help and I couldn't allow my daughter to move the couch by herself.

Kelly was free with the needle and merciless about any perceived weakness. Being a maudlin Irishman I would often cry at sentimental movies. Kelly would, with great glee, make fun of the emotion and get us all laughing. She was the only one that could get Roxy to admit that she was hard of hearing or needed to see the doctor or any number of things I had been trying to get Roxy to do for months. When the Covid-19 pandemic started, Kelly ruled the house with an iron hand, disinfecting and keeping us safe while she ran our errands.

Kelly was fierce in her friendships and in her views of what was right and wrong. She was unafraid to tell you when you were screwing up and ready to admit her shortfalls. She absolutely doted on her neices and nephews, loved her brothers and their wives, and did her best for her parents. I am proud of the person she had become and proud to call her my daughter. I don't know how I will fill the hole she left.

The ability to work through problems and the focus to accomplish anything she set her mind to were the qualities that carried her through a number of career changes and different settings.

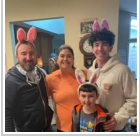

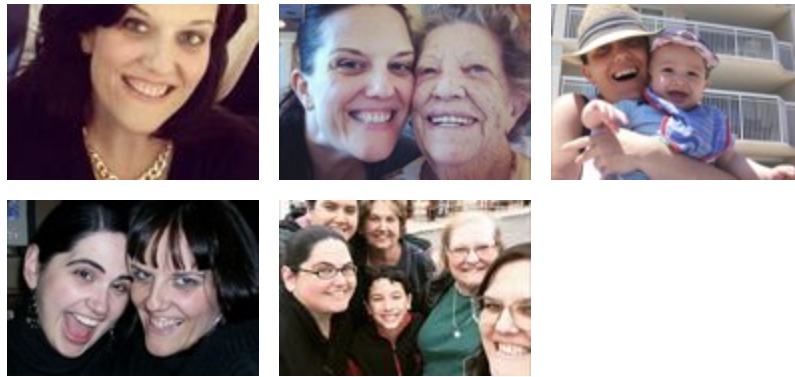

She was love. She was kindness. She was ours.....and she will forever be OUR Kelly. ❤️

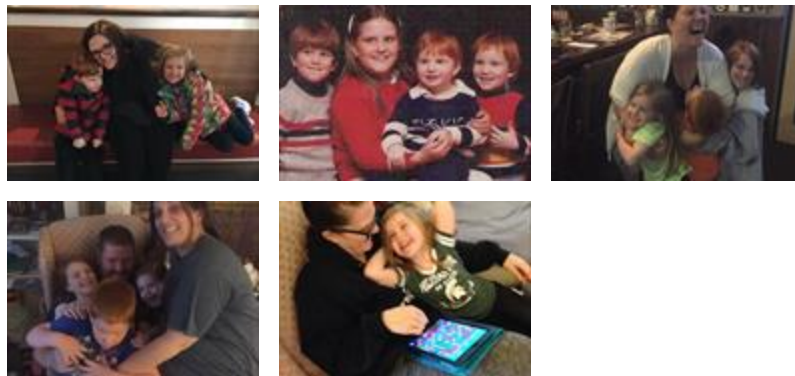
