



Roseann "Rose" Bolone

May 17, 1953 - May 5, 2022

Roseann "Rose" Bolone of Valrico, Florida and formerly of Shelby Township, Michigan passed away on May 5, 2022. Roseann was born in Detroit, Michigan on May 17, 1953—the third of six children and the only blue eyed, tow-headed blonde in a gang of dark-haired Italians and Hungarians. Anyone in the extended family always knew who Roseann was—just look for the hair.

Even though she was originally a Utica High School Chieftain, then a Northern Michigan University Wildcat, Roseann became a diehard Wolverine—a University of Michigan fan through and through. If there was a U of M happening anywhere in the state of Florida, she was there. Attending a Michigan sporting event with Roseann required Michigan attire, though--even for those Sparty fans. Go Blue!

The majority of Roseann's professional career was spent working at McDonald's. Serving in many roles, she was eventually promoted to Area Supervisor with the McDonald's Corporation in Michigan. Most recently and while semi-retired, Roseann worked at the Valrico McDonalds as a manager where she continued until she left us. She particularly liked working with and mentoring young crew members—managers too. Roseann was called Ms. Rose by her crew, and they were all like family to her. They looked up to her--likely because she ran an efficient ship. She was fair and consistent—one always knew where they stood with Ms. Rose. Ebony, the store manager of

the Valrico store, said, "Ms. Rose was always a blessing. I wouldn't be where I am today if it weren't for her". Roseann wasn't a passive manager, either. She woke at 3 a.m. four days a week in order to open the store and was frequently seen running food for Michelle at the drive through, calling orders at the same time. Her Valrico store will be closed for a brief time on Roseann's birthday to celebrate her. Such was the impact Roseann had on those around her.

Roseann moved to Florida for the warm weather, though she wasn't a beach person and hated sand. She had her home built in Valrico—a 4-bedroom split-ranch with lanai and pool. Single, Roseann purchased a home larger than her needs so that family and friends could visit. All were welcome. One Christmas, 17 family members gathered there to celebrate the holiday. Everyone slept in three bedrooms, the den, on sofa beds in the living and family rooms, and on blow-up air mattresses anywhere there was floor space. It was wall-to-wall family and a Christmas that will always be remembered.

A lifelong athlete, Roseann loved all sports, was an avid golfer and softball player. Wednesday was her golf day when she enjoyed league golf with friends Sandy N, Pat, Chris, Meg, and Sandy S. Wednesday golf was sacred to her, and everyone knew not to call her until after she left the course. Until recently, when Roseann wasn't playing golf or working, she was playing senior softball with the Jolico 65 softball team, and with lifelong friend and longtime teammate, Pat Wieland, Robin the organizer who was too young to play, and coached by Jan Sander and Chris Schneider. The team particularly enjoyed ravioli dinner with Rose at her house--Mama Rose delighted to be doing the cooking. They were family.

Roseann loved Mickey Mouse and Disney. For many years, she held season passes to Disney World and was a collector of Mickey Mouse memorabilia. An entire room at her home is dedicated to the Mouse. The family isn't sure she moved to Florida for the warm weather or to be closer to Mickey.

While we are all missing Roseann terribly, she would likely say, "Really, are you kidding me? I am having a wonderful time sitting on the heavenly lanai with those I have been missing—Dad (Peter Bolone), Mom, (Roseann Bolone-Peacock), Cheryl Temple (sister), and beloved friend, Janice Dinezza. We are eating family ravioli, with meatballs and sauce—not too thick, Caesar salad with Renee's Caesar dressing, and garlic bread. We have plenty of Locatelli Romano to sprinkle on top. ESPN is on the TV, and we have chocolate cake, ice cream, and cold milk for dessert."

Roseann will continue to be missed by so many, including her brother, Peter John Bolone, Jr. (Marlina) of Shelby Twp., MI, sister, Lori Richardson (Tyron) of Shelby Twp., MI, twins, Donna Bartlett (Robert) of Crofton, MD and Darlene Bolone (Janet) of Warren, MI, nieces Renee Kavalari (Mark), Roselina Bolone, Katie Baird (Jason), Alexandra and Victoria Bartlett, nephews Theodore Achatz (Michele), Peter John Bolone, III, Brandon Kaczmarek (Jennifer), Jon Bolone (Rebecca), and 10 great nieces and nephews and one great-great nephew. While Roseann was proud of all of her nieces and nephews, she would likely point out that she was proud godmother to nephew, Peter.

Her Florida families, the Smigiels—Chester, Sandy, Stephanie, Jackson, and sweet Katie, along with neighbors, the Ryans-- Mike and Amanda, will miss Roseann also. They will remember their beloved friend and dear neighbor. Cherished friends and good neighbors are hard to come by, but Roseann was blessed to have many of both.

Roseann would prefer that all of us left behind were celebrating her life somewhere on the 19th hole. Even though she always cried when hugging her family to say goodbye, she may be a bit annoyed with those of us who are emotional at the thought of her passing. Still, we are hugging her now and

shedding a few tears.

Visitation will be on Saturday, May 14, 2022 from 9:00-11:30 a.m. at Wujek - Calcaterra & Sons funeral home located at 54880 Van Dyke Ave., Shelby Twp, MI, 48316. Service will follow at 11:30. Visitors are encouraged to wear their favorite golf or U of M gear and jeans if preferred. I want to share a couple of stories I have of Rose. She was a strong, funny and compassionate woman and it has been an honor to call her my friend.

I met Rose back in 2008, I was a young twenty something GM at that time in Brandon, FL. My supervisor at the time interviewed Rose and wanted me to Oje her. Rose and I packed our bags and drove to Augusta Georgia in 2017 to attend one of the greatest golf tournaments in the world. My dear friend kept her word all those years. But that was Rose!

Rosie as I sometimes called her or Bologna (she did not like that nick name) was a special person. She had a caring heart and a warmth about her. She loved her family and talked about them often. Prayers go out to the family during this difficult time.
